Well, here we are in the season of Lent and many of you ask....exactly what is Lent? The word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten* which means lengthen and refers to the lengthening days of spring. It consists of the 40 days (not counting Sundays) which begins with Ash Wednesday and runs through Maundy Thursday.

Lent is a season of preparation and repentance. During this 40-day journey, we are encouraged to think about our own mortality and sinfulness. We recognize our need to let go of our sinful ways and shortcomings in order to create room for the abundant grace, mercy, and love of our Lord Jesus Christ. It's a time for self-examination:

A time to look at things we knowingly do wrong that separate us from God.

A time to give up things that keep us from being the good neighbor that God created us to be

A time to exercise discipline in order to draw closer to God.

A time to discover how to love as God loves.

During Lent include these three practices daily:

Prayer Fasting (or Sacrifice) Giving

God calls us to a life filled with love, service, and deep connection with Him.

This season of Lent is a six-week journey set apart for the purpose of drawing closer to God. Always remember – as we draw closer to God, He will draw closer to us.

Chardonniere Baptist Church Roof Update— Let's Help Them Finish This Project By Summer!

Friends of Chardonniere Church, Bonjou!

As you may know, since October 2021, our sister church in Haiti has been without a church building to worship in and to teach the 200+ students like they did when our mission team went in 2018. Due to the wisdom of the Session and the generosity of our congregation, we started an ambitious project to help them rebuild the church. Essentially, the rebuild project is about half done and is on hold until more funding is procured, and construction can restart. We as a congregation have continued to pray for this and the members of Chardonniere have been making do with what they can for their worship and for the school. I personally have been working to try to find additional funding and grants over the past 5 months. I wanted to provide the status of the project for our congregation. We are still about \$40,000 short of completing the project, but the good news is that I have commitments for about \$15,000 from outside sources! This leaves us about \$25,000 short. We have been very generous in the past for Haiti, so I have been hesitant to ask for more but the Session on February 27th asked that I make one final request to try to raise this amount from the congregation. If there are those that would like to contribute to help complete this project, this is the time to do it! Here are the numbers:

Initial estimate of: March 2022 \$37,500

Revised estimate of: October 2023 \$65,000 (due to increase of material & shipping)

Donated to date as of: March 2024 \$25,000

Needed to complete the roof & walls: \$40,000 (Possible outside contributions of \$15k)

We would like to send whatever is collected by May 2024 so construction can restart this summer and be completed before the winter rains. What a glorious gift this would be that would impact the church, school, and community for years to come!

If you care to donate, please send a check or contribute online to the church. Please designate the donation as the Chardonniere Building Fund. Naturally it is tax deductible. It would be such a blessing to complete this project this year!
